In His DEATHS and RESURRECTION

He was assigned a grave with the wicked, He was crucified between two thieves; and with the rich man in his death, He was buried in a rich man's tomb. Though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth. Isaiah 53:7-11 (Take time to read all of Isaiah 53 about how Christ suffered for us!)

I am thankful for our English translations which help us know God and Jesus Christ his Son. But the English language is not as astute as is either the Hebrew or Greek. Look at the words above — in His death. In the original language it says DEATHS. (Plural) We ask well what does that mean? In Hebrew when a word seems like it should be singular but it is plural, **it is a sign that the reality behind the word is so huge, so unique, so intense, so extreme or so colossal that the singular word DEATH cannot contain all that it means.** Death is a singular word in English, but is a plural in the Hebrew.

Thus it could be translated <u>in His deaths</u>. What it means is that Messiah would die just one death but it would be many deaths. **He would not die just for Himself but He** would die for all those who would accept His death. That would include you and me. Every death— present and future— is contained in his death. What that means is that our old life— my old life, your old life— no longer exists. When we become a child of God the judgement of our sin, which is death, has ended.

For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again. 2 Corinthians 5:14,15

Paul indicates in 1 Corinthians that the same thing could be said of resurrection. Because Christ died for our sins and rose again, we can say with Paul, **"Where, O death, in your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?... But thanks be to God! He gives us victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." 1 Corinthians 15:55,57.** (Read the entire 15th chapter to learn more about the resurrection of Christ and our resurrection.

Let us rejoice in the deaths of Christ and the fact that Jesus was resurrected also means that we too shall be resurrected from the dead! THANK YOU, JE-SUS!
